



## RfP Evaluation: A Researcher of anti-corruption policies in selected Slovak institutions

### 1. Proposals received

The Selection Committee received proposals to RfP from the following applicants:

1. Slovak Governance Institute (SGI)
2. Team led by doc. Martin Klus, Ph.D.

Four parties previously indicated their tentative interest to submit proposals. Only one did not do so. The remaining candidate joined a team of another candidate. Received proposals had been forwarded to the members of Selection Committee on Monday, November 15, 2010.

### 2. Selection Committee Composition Changes

Selection Committee Members Ms Emília Sičáková-Beblavá and Mr Andrej Salner resigned from their positions citing potential conflict of interests. Both of them are or have been affiliated with one of the applicants – Slovak Governance Institute – Ms Sičáková-Beblavá being one of the founding members and Mr Salner being a partner of the Institute. Both resigned prior the evaluation process.

Mr Peter Goliaš, director of Institute for Economic and Social Reforms (INEKO) had accepted membership in the Selection Committee.

### 3. Proposals Evaluation

Selection Committee Members evaluated proposals according to criteria outlined in the RfP and ranked the applicants:

1. Slovak Governance Institute (SGI) (3 times first place)
2. Team led by doc. Martin Klus, Ph.D. (3 times second place)
